WHICH FUEL ARE YOU USING?



There are dozens of good reasons to memorize Scripture. Just to name a few, memorizing Scripture leads to strength (Psa. 119:92), fruitfulness (Psa. 1:2-3), peace (Psa. 119:165), obedience (Psa. 119:11), improved prayer (John 15:7), and faith (Rom. 10:17).

But the fact is, most of us don't need to be convinced that memorizing Scripture is worthwhile. We all believe Scripture memory is beneficial; the problem is that we underestimate the consequences of neglecting it. This is the same reason most people choose regular unleaded when filling their cars with gas. We understand that the expensive fuel is better, but we're pretty sure the cheap stuff will suffice.

When you memorize Scripture, you're giving your heart the ultra-pure fuel of God's Word (Prov. 30:5). And unlike putting gas in your Corolla, compromise in this area leads to very real, long-term consequences. If your walk with God is fueled only by Christian ideas, you may not notice a difference when the road is easy. But when you travel uphill—facing decisions, temptation, or trial—the surest way to avoid a misfire is to follow the model of Psalm 37:31, “The law of his God is in his heart; none of his steps shall slide.”

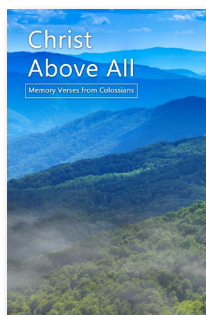

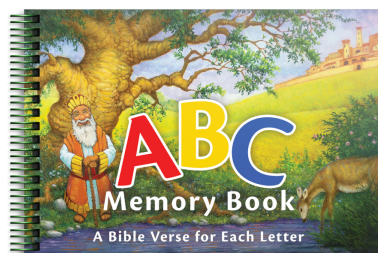

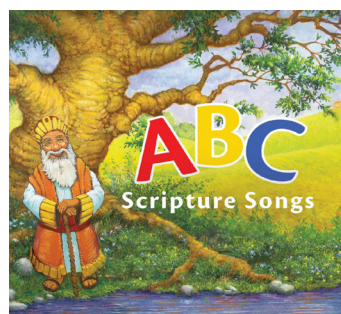

PREVENTABLE DISASTER *by Jim Woychuk*

We're enduring a wave of apostasy in the American church. The casualty list includes celebrities and our own children. "From that time many of His disciples went back and walked with Him no more" (John 6:66). Perhaps this falling away is an end-times necessity (2 Thess. 2:3). But could some of the fault lie in the way we do church and the Christian life? Have we fought for doctrinal purity in our churches only to leave our Bibles lying on the shelf? Are we among those "who have received the law by the direction of angels and have not kept it" (Acts 7:53)?

As you may have discovered, memorizing Scripture is something of a novelty among Christians. It's looked on as "kid stuff" or something we used to do in college or when we first trusted Christ. How many adults do you know who have this discipline as a fixture in their lives? Do they amount to 10% of our Christian acquaintances? Perhaps not.

Yet lying at the heart of the Great Command (Deut. 6:5) and the Great Commission (Matt. 28:19-20) is the assumption that we will memorize God's words systematically, durably, and continuously. "And these words which I command you today shall be in your heart" (Deut. 6:6). Besides going and baptizing, Jesus specifies "teaching them to observe all things that I have commanded you" as the means of disciple-making. The word "observe" (*tereo*) means to guard and preserve something from being lost. When all else fails, follow the instructions.

MINISTRY UPDATE *by Dakota Lynch*

Over the last two months, our staff has attended four conventions in three states. Our goal at these events is to persuade as many families as possible to memorize Scripture as a way of life. This message is

critically important in an age when the average Christian has memorized very little (if any) Scripture. My heart was broken at an event in Texas when I met a couple of pastor's kids, neither of whom knew John 3:16. For them and countless others, "the sword of the Spirit" (Eph. 6:17) is gathering dust in some neglected corner of life while lesser things consume time and attention.

The words of Hosea 4:6 are increasingly descriptive of our times: "My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge...." This is a problem too big for one person or ministry to solve, but we praise God for the big things He is doing through the ministry of SMF. Our annual Scripture Memory Camp is scheduled for July, and we are anticipating the best turnout in years. We're also excited to announce a brand-new Scripture memory course, *The Classics: 100 Bible Verses Everyone Should Know* (pg. 1).
